Excerpt from Policy on Appointment, Reappointment & Clinical Privileges of the Presbyterian Hospital Medical Staff

ARTICLE II - PART F:

Section 2. Temporary Clinical Privileges for Non-Applicants:

Admitting and clinical privileges for care of a specific patient or patients may be granted by the President of the Hospital with the concurrence of either the chairperson of the department concerned, the Chairperson of the Credentials Committee or the Chief of Staff to a physician who is not an applicant for appointment in the same manner and upon the same conditions as set forth in Section I of this Part, provided that the President of the Hospital shall first obtain such individual's signed acknowledgment to be bound by the hospital bylaws, this policy, the medical staff bylaws, and the medical staff rules and regulations then in force in all matters relating to temporary clinical privileges. Such privileges shall be restricted to a period of 30 days, after which time these privileges automatically expire and the physician or oral surgeon shall be required to apply for appointment to the Medical Staff before being allowed to attend additional patients.

SECTION .0700 - CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION FOR VISITING PROFESSORS

21 NCAC 32B .0701 REQUEST FOR THE CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION

A written request for the Certificate of Registration for a Visiting Professor shall come from the dean of the medical school to which the applicant is seeking appointment. This request shall state the qualifications, position, responsibilities, and length of appointment of the visiting professor for whom the request is made.

21 NCAC 32B .0702 MEDICAL LICENSURE

The visiting professor applicant must furnish proof of medical licensure in another state or foreign country by submitting a letter from the licensing agency indicating the status of the applicant's license.

21 NCAC 32B .0707 CERTIFIED PHOTOGRAPH

The visiting professor applicant must furnish a recent photograph, at least 2.2 inches by 3.3 inches, certified on the back as a true likeness of the applicant by the dean or other official of his medical school. This certification must bear the signature of the dean or other official of the medical school and the seal of the medical school.

IRREGULAR CONSULTATIONS ABOUT EDUCATIONAL OR MEDICAL TRAINING BY PHYSICIANS LICENSED IN OTHER STATES

The Medical Board of North Carolina has determined that the Medical Practice Act of North Carolina permits a physician licensed in another State to come in on an irregular basis for educational purposes.

§ 90-18. Practicing without license; practicing defined; penalties.

(a) No person shall practice medicine or surgery, or any of the branches thereof, nor in any case prescribe for the cure of diseases unless the person shall have been first licensed and registered so to do in the manner provided in this Article, and if any person shall practice medicine or surgery without being duly licensed and registered, as provided in this Article, the person shall not be allowed to maintain any action to collect any fee for such services. The person so practicing without license shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.

(b) Any person shall be regarded as practicing medicine or surgery within the meaning of this Article who shall diagnose or attempt to diagnose, treat or attempt to treat, operate or attempt to operate on, or prescribe for or administer to, or profess to treat any human ailment, physical or mental, or any physical injury to or deformity of another person. A person who resides in any state or foreign country and who, by use of any electronic or other mediums, performs any of the acts described in this subsection, including prescribing medication by use of the Internet or a toll-free telephone number, shall be regarded as practicing medicine or surgery and shall be subject to the provisions of this Article and appropriate regulation by the North Carolina Medical Board.

(c) The following shall not constitute practicing medicine or surgery as defined in subsection (b) of this section:

...

- (11) **The practice of medicine or surgery by any nonregistered reputable physician or surgeon who comes into this State, either in person or by use of any electronic or other mediums, on an irregular basis, to consult with a resident registered physician or to consult with personnel at a medical school about educational or medical training.** This proviso shall not apply to physicians resident in a neighboring state and regularly practicing in this State.

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
